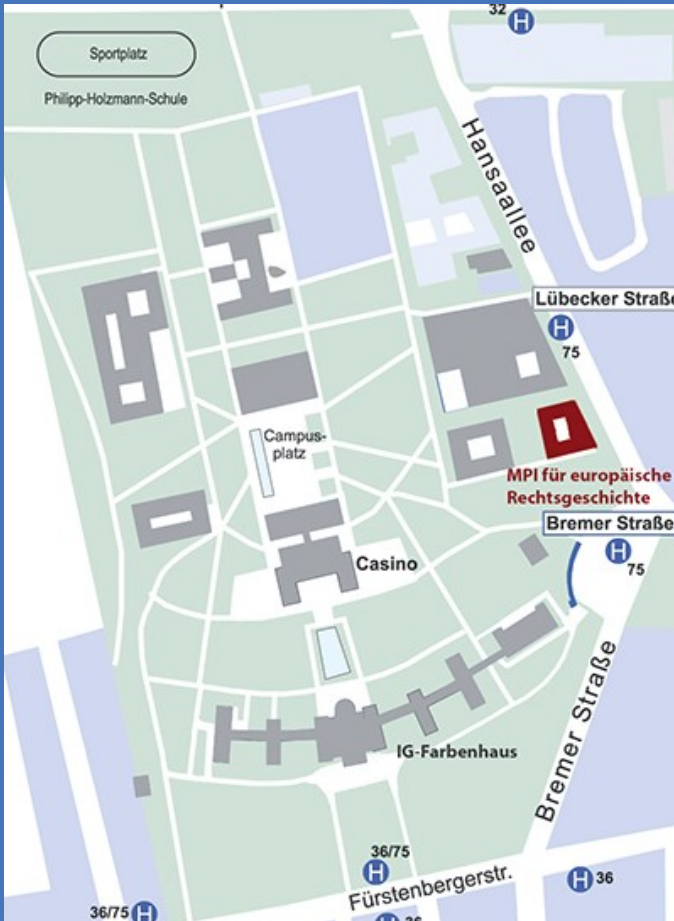

Arrival

By car

- A5 to Nordwestkreuz Frankfurt (Frankfurt North West intersection)
- or A66 towards Nordwestkreuz Frankfurt
- then A66 towards Frankfurt Miquelallee / Stadtmitte
- stay on Miquelallee / B8
- then follow sign Fulda / Hanau / Frankfurt / Stadtmitte
- then run right at the first traffic light junction Miquelallee / Hansaallee into Hansaallee

By rail

- from the Hauptbahnhof S-Bahn line S1-S6 or S8, S9 to Hauptwache
- then U-Bahn line U1-U3 or U8 to station Holzhausenstraße

or

- from the Hauptbahnhof U-Bahn line U4 to Bockenheimer Warte
- then busline 75, direction Campus Westend (only during the semester from Monday to Friday between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m.)
- then alight at bus stop Bremer Platz

By plane

- from Frankfurt Airport by taxi approx. 15 minutes

or

- S-Bahn line S8, S9 to Hauptwache
- then U-Bahn line U1-U3 or U8 to station Holzhausenstraße
